



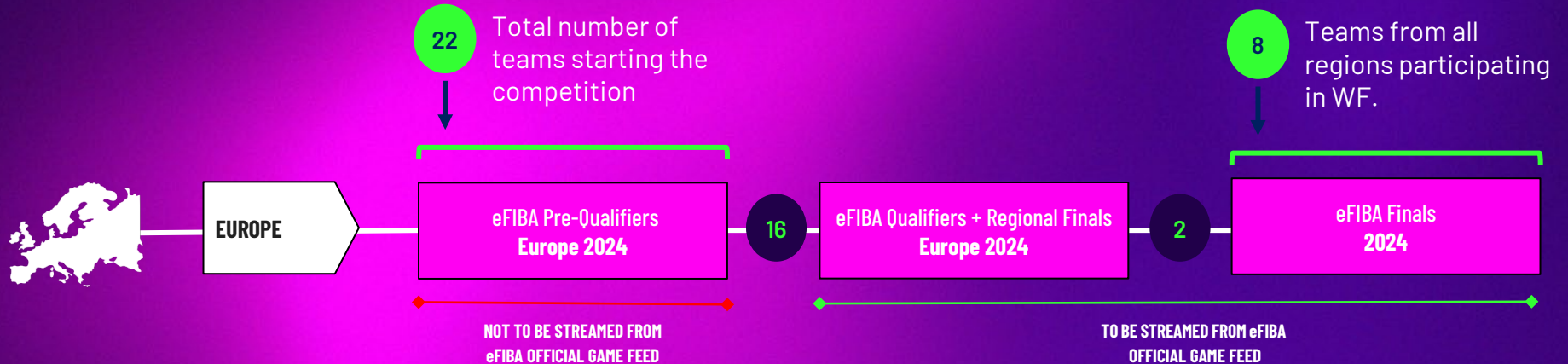

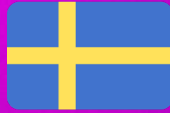

SWISS FORMAT COMPETITION SYSTEM



EUROPEAN REGIONAL-QUALIFIERS FORMAT FOR THE SEASON

At the end of the Pre-Qualifier stage, the 16 remaining teams will progress to the next stage (the Regional Qualifier stage) on a 'sequence' basis, based on their results in the previous stage. A draw will be made to determine the match-ups.

EUROPEAN CALENDAR FOR THE SEASON

DICTIONARY

- **B02 / Home and Away (Best of two):** Each time a match-up is played on B02, this means that two games will be played between the teams. The winner of these match-ups will be the team with the most points accumulated between the two games. A win gives you two points and a lose one point.
- **B03 (Best of three):** Each time a match is played on a B03, this means that at least two games will be played between the teams. The third game is only required if the previous two games have been won by different teams. The team that hosts the third game will be the team with the most points between the two games, so this is not determined in advance. B03 is only used for play-offs and regional finals. In order to win this match-up you'll need to win at least two games.
- **Swiss System Format:** This format is used for the European Regional Qualifiers, where teams only play teams with the same record at that stage.
- **Elimination/Advancing stage at Swiss Format:** 8 teams will progress from this stage and 8 teams will be eliminated. You need to win 3 matches to progress or lose 3 matches to be eliminated.
